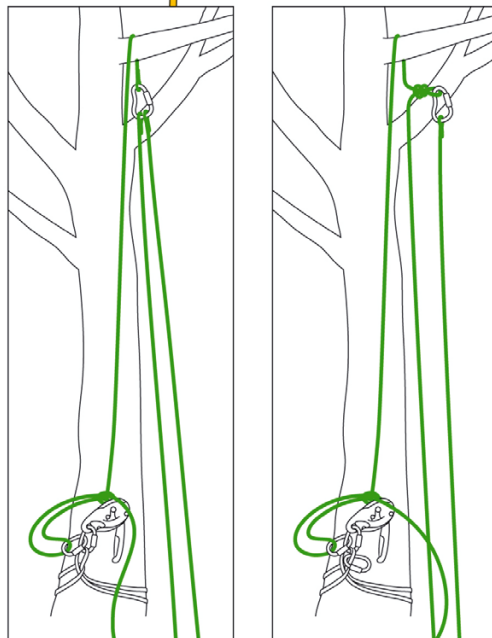
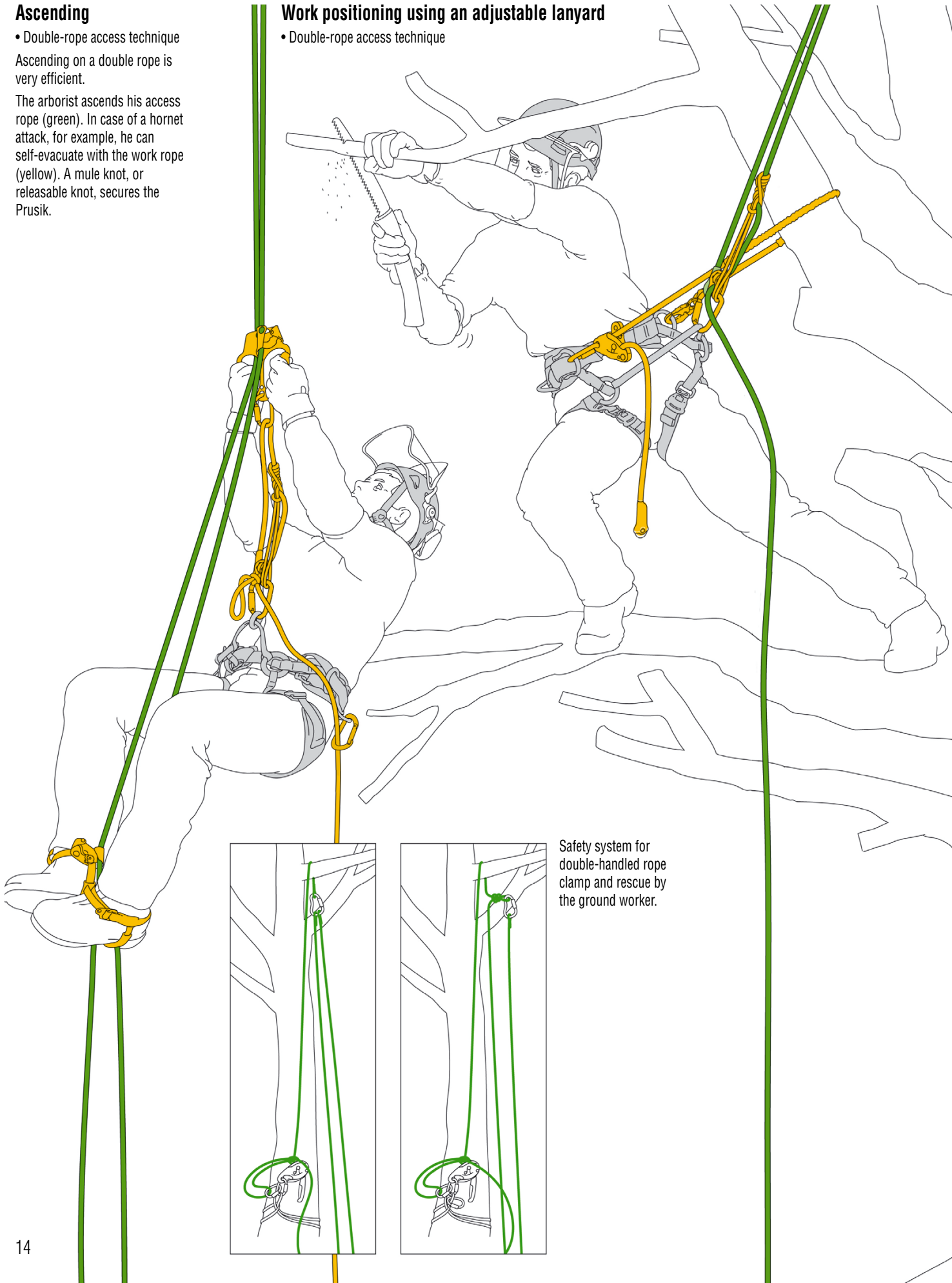
- Double-rope access technique

Ascending on a double rope is very efficient.

The arborist ascends his access rope (green). In case of a hornet attack, for example, he can self-evacuate with the work rope (yellow). A mule knot, or releasable knot, secures the Prusik.

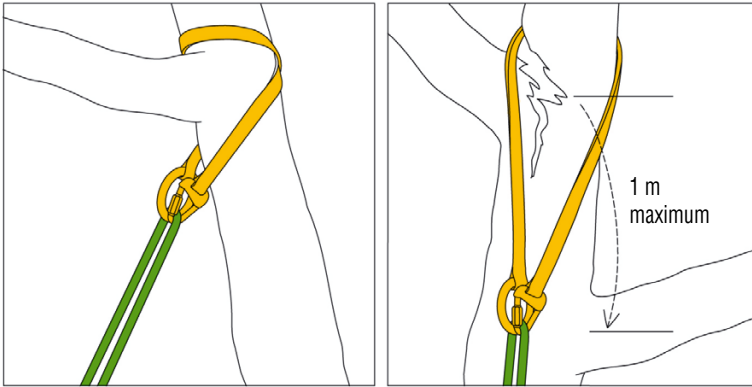
Work positioning using an adjustable lanyard

- Double-rope access technique



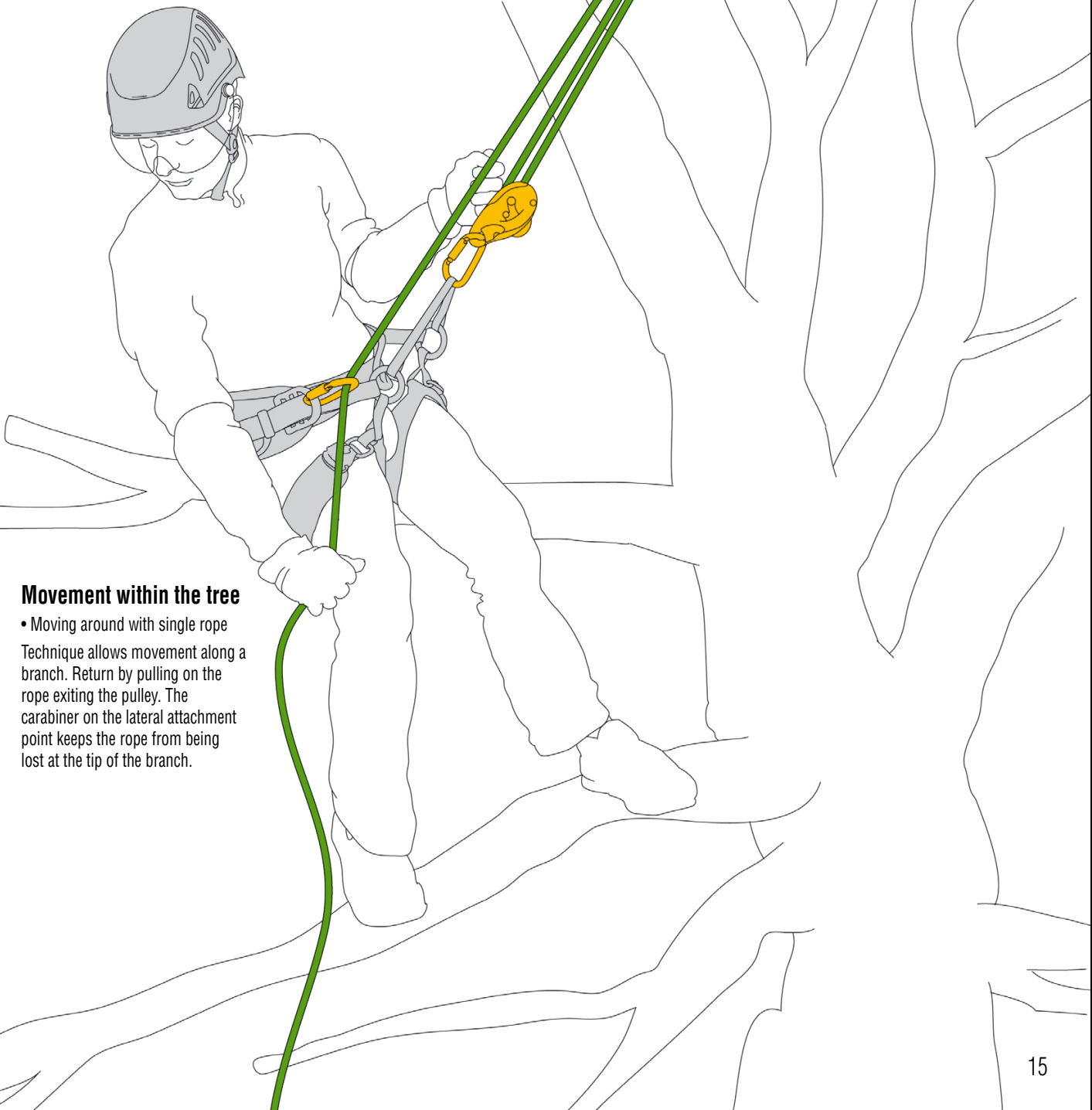
Safety system for double-handled rope clamp and rescue by the ground worker.

Movement within the tree

- Moving around with single rope
- Technique allows movement along a branch. Return by pulling on the rope exiting the pulley. The carabiner on the lateral attachment point keeps the rope from being lost at the tip of the branch.
